## **ALUMNI INTERVIEW**

Jessica Clews attended Playbox for several years as a teenager, where she gained the confidence to successfully apply to drama school, East 15, where she has just completed her first year. Jess' reflections are especially important as the upcoming holiday project 'The Actor as Artist' is a very useful asset to anyone also considering applying to university with a career in theatre in mind. #### Introduce yourself Jess, what are you up to?

I am Jess Clews, an actor and singer currently training at East 15 Acting School on the BA World Performance course. I attended Playbox Theatre for around 7 years, participating in many classes including acting, musical theatre and professionals. Going to Playbox hugely boosted my confidence in the performance and audition space both for singing and acting. I am an aspiring opera singer and hope my future is set in Covent Garden's Royal Opera House!

# Nearly 12 months later, can you give us any reflections on your experience on applying to drama school and the experience of it so far?

Drama school! Where do I even begin? I got into drama school after having taken a gap year and was absolutely gobsmacked when I got in. In my summer before auditioning, I think research was my best friend. Every drama school is different in terms of specialities, conduct and fields of strength. I looked at all the big names like RADA and LAMDA, but nothing caught my eye like the smaller drama school courses did, where they have more unique and specialised courses. So, research, research is my biggest first step.

# To add to that, what would you suggest anyone who is looking at applying to drama schools can do to prepare?

Get into reading plays! With the stress of picking audition monologues, it is very easy to fall down the hole of googling 'monologues for teenagers' and finding something that fits the needs but doesn't truly resonate with you. I spent my gap year summer reading many plays, both classical and contemporary, to pick out a handful of monologues that I felt I could truly understand emotionally and felt I would entirely enjoy performing over and over again, as getting your best take of a monologue often takes time. There is no point in picking monologues that bore you!

Once you have found your monologues, get learning them as quickly as possible. You will likely be performing them many times for many different schools and many different takes of a filmed audition. Find a friend or family member to help you as quite often I find I get frustrated when I am learning alone.

Besides from audition prep, open your eyes up to the world of acting we have around us. At the touch of a button on a remote, you can access millions of incredible TV shows and movies that showcase the very best of talent in the acting world. If you are lucky enough to be in a financial position to go to the theatre, go to see as much as you can as well. From West End musicals to small street performances, always make time for experiencing acting. Even art exhibitions, museums and concerts can open your eyes up to what art is happening around you and to keep up what is relevant right now.
